Decorated Air Force veteran

Retired Air Force Col. Henry G. Hamby Jr. died Sunday evening, July 19, in Fairfax, at age 93.

Col. Hamby was a 29year resident of Williamsburg and parishioner of Bruton Parish Church. He

and his late wife, Dorothy, resided on Cole Lane until her passing in 2007, when he

moved to Fairfax to be

close to his family. He was born in Dawson Springs, Ky., on Jan. 10, 1916. In 1941, he was commissioned in the Army Air Force and got married in March

1942. He continued his career after World War II in the Air Force. He was the first commanding officer of the 310th Troop Carrier Squadron, dropping paratroopers in combat at Normandy and Holland in 1944, and was decorated with the Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal, and Polish Cross of Valor.

Following his retirement from military service in 1969, Col. Hamby was director of College Development & Planning for Slippery Rock College,

He and his wife settled in Williamsburg in 1978, becoming active members of the community, including Meals on Wheels, the Chamberlain Society, hospital volunteers, patrons of Colonial Williamsburg, and Bruton Parish Church.
